



Standings before the last rounds:

1–3. GMs Kovalyov (2617), Shankland (2602) and Macieja (2583) – 6/8, etc (74 players)


The following endgame shows how important it is to know theoretical endgames:



This tournament took place in Las Vegas on 26–30 December 2013.






White is clearly winning, but the Hungarian GM made a horrible blunder: 35. ∃xf7?? ₩a1+ 0-1

Gomez Camacho (1898) – Assaubayeva (1974) WYCC U16 Girls Al-Ain (8), 24.12.2013




Black is lost, but she sped up her demise: 23... 2d7?? 24. 2dxe6+! 1-0




